I am writing to formally express my opposition to your decision to vote against holding a public hearing on the CZB impacting Area G. By not allowing a public forum, residents are being denied a fair and necessary opportunity to share their perspectives on an issue that carries significant and lasting implications for our community.

I do not agree with what is being proposed in the new texts, and I know I am far from alone in this view. Many members of our community share serious concerns about both the content of these proposed changes and the process by which they are being advanced.

At a time when we are facing a growing energy crisis, it is deeply concerning to see efforts focused on restructuring land use without the infrastructure in place to properly support such changes. Proceeding under these circumstances feels not only premature, but irresponsible.

I strongly urge you to postpone this bylaw until after the upcoming local government elections, when there can be meaningful public engagement, greater transparency, and proper accountability.

Attempting to push forward bylaws of this scale while simultaneously avoiding public input is deeply troubling and reflects a process that many would view as underhanded and disingenuous.
